You may have heard the saying "A leopard does not change its spots." It is generally used in a negative or cynical tone to suggest that people who are wrong-doers or criminals will not or cannot change their ways. Today's readings suggest however that change is possible. If we are honest with ourselves, we know that there are aspects of our lives that could or should be changed. We sometimes refer to these as the "dark corners" of our lives. It is in these dark corners that Jesus comes to save us. In the Gospel reading, St Matthew describes how Jesus challenged the chief priests and leaders of the people to change their ways since they had ignored John the Baptist's call to return to God's ways. Today, as we listen to this Gospel, Jesus challenges us to change our own ways and follow him. This involves personal renewal of heart and commitment to living lives of faithfulness and service of others. I am reminded of the words of the psalmist: "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." (Ps 95). Having received Jesus in the Eucharist today, let us ask Him to soften our hearts.
