Easter Reflection 2020

Our journey to Easter this year has taken place in the midst of the Covid-19 virus. We have been confronting many challenges during this pandemic, with all of its fears and uncertainties about the future. We are experiencing anxiety and uncertainty, now and even about the future. In many ways the world finds itself imprisoned or enslaved by our present predicament. We cry out for liberation and freedom. One of the scripture readings from the Easter Vigil is the story of the Exodus. It calls to mind a God, who liberates his people and leads them to freedom, to become a new people. They are invited to come to know the closeness of the liberating presence of God with them.

Out of love for humankind, the death of Jesus Christ on the cross embraces all that has enslaved humanity all that is fragmented and evil. Through the resurrection of Jesus, Christ liberates us from all that enslaves and imprisons us, our fears, sicknesses, evil actions, even death itself. The resurrection of Jesus begins a new liberation of humankind, a new way of being human together in God's world. Through our baptism, we enter into this new liberation. With the spirit of the risen Christ alive in us, we continue the liberating action of God. We see expressions of this liberating activity, even now during this pandemic. We offer an enormous sense of gratitude to the courageous and persevering efforts of medical teams, doctors, nurses, welfare and government agencies. We are also conscious that so many ordinary people have been giving of themselves, ensuring that the Social Distancing measures become signs of that liberating activity which enable us to be free from this disease. May we find hope this Easter, in the one whose life and resurrection has given true liberation to our world and even over the reality of death itself. May we allow the risen Christ to continue his liberating activity through us now and into the future.
