The Prayer of the Frog

by Anthony de Mello Page 70

The important religious distinction is not between those who worship and those who do not worship but between those who love and those who don't.

Two of the most spoken words in the English language are 'yes' and 'no'. In today's world we often hear them pronounced as 'Yeah' and 'Nah'. They are simple words but may express our consent or denial of complex realities. In today's Gospel, St Luke tells the story of the 'yes' that changed the course of history and allowed God to become one of us. It is the story of a young Jewish woman who responds to God's invitation to make a home for Jesus and bring Him to birth. According to Luke, Mary does not use the word 'yes' but this is her intent when she says, "I am the handmaid of the Lord, let what you have said be done to me." As we prepare to celebrate again the birth of Jesus, the Church reminds us that we also are being invited each day to make a home for Jesus in our own hearts, our families, our parish, and our communities. How will I respond to this invitation?
