GOSPEL REFLECTION

Jesus outcast for us!

Lepers were social outcasts forced to live outside the villages and towns. Jesus heals the leper, allowing him to return to communal living, but, in touching him, Jesus put himself on the outer. The Gospel says that Jesus 'had to stay outside where nobody lived'. Jesus willingly changed places with the leper!

This incident prefigures the deepest mystery and scandal of the Gospel. Because of our deliberate wrongdoing, we are 'on the outside' with God. Our Lord and Saviour willingly experienced that alienation on Calvary, *outside* the walls of Jerusalem, in a desolate place where no-body lived. He suffered the dis-locating consequences of sin in his body and mind: 'My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?'

He took our place outside the human awareness of the loving presence of His Heavenly Father so that we might be located in the right place, *insiders* with God.

We might pause for a moment to lovingly thank our Saviour for leading us into 'the One in Whom we live and move and have our being'.

REPORT FROM THE MEETING OF THE PARISH LEADERSHIP TEAM, 9TH FEBRUARY 2021

Parish life in COVID normal: We recognise that with continuing outbreaks of COVID-19 it is important to ensure that parish life continues in a safe manner mindful of our responsibility for the safety and wellbeing of all in our community. Our current practices (such as live streaming of Masses, Trybooking for Sunday Masses, meetings via Zoom, electronic communications) will continue for the foreseeable future and we encourage all parishioners to be attentive and responsive to the needs of family members, friends, and fellow parishioners. We emphasise the importance of the parish website in maintaining communication and connection with each other.

<u>Sacramental programs 2020/2021</u>: Because of COVID restrictions celebrations of the sacraments of Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation have had to be held over from 2020 and will be completed during the first school term. We thanked all involved at parish and school level for their work in preparing the children and in planning for the delayed celebrations of these sacraments.
