A reflection...

"To err is human, to forgive Divine".

This famous quote by Alexander Pope is as simple as it states. As humans, we are prone to making mistakes and missing the mark. Sometimes knowingly, and other times unknowingly. What remains unchanging is the openness of our Father, through our Saviour, to continually offer forgiveness and reunite us to Himself. Do we recognise when we have erred? Do we sincerely seek God's forgiveness? How challenging is it for us to forgive each other *'seventy times seven'*?

In the second reading, we see how forgiveness is an ongoing action to restore us to God. He welcomes us back again and again when we repent. But at the same time, we are told that if we **truly know God**, we should keep His commandments. Our actions should reflect the relationship we have with our Father and each other. Jesus summed up the commandments into two simple parts: Love the Lord your God (with every part of you) and love your neighbour as you love yourself. As we continue to walk our life journey, we may sometimes falter. Remaining true to seeking the fulness of knowing God and hence trying our best to steer clear of what is wrong in God's eyes, will allow God's love to be perfected in us. It is this same love that will allow us to forgive *'seventy times seven'* as Jesus instructed. In the Gospel, Jesus graces his disciples with peace and understanding of the scripture. One key message he imparts is that *"repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations"*. How blessed are we to be part of the nations that now witness this message today!

We are set free from the bonds of sin through the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. Are we any closer to truly knowing God?
