REFLECTION....

Last week, we reflected on who Jesus is to us personally. This week, we hear Jesus tell his disciples that "whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

Jesus makes it clear that a response is required on our part. He invites us to reflect on what truly matters—and what this means for us personally.

What does it mean to deny ourselves, to pick up our cross, and follow the one who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life? When we find ourselves in a time of trial or suffering, we may feel inclined to wrestle with our circumstances, to stubbornly avoid pain, to do anything possible to make the problem go away. But this can sometimes come at a cost. Does this grasping for comfort involve moving away from the Lord, or closer to Him?

Sometimes it is only once we realise we have reached the end of ourselves that we remember to turn to God. In my life, it is precisely during moments of trial and suffering that I have experienced greater trust and faith in the Lord, which have allowed me to grow closer to Him in the process. In the words of Fr. Jacques Philippe, "Every trial, no matter what its cause and characteristics are, is a trial of faith or of hope or of love." Thus, we can, with the help of God's grace, try to respond to our more challenging circumstances with faith, hope, or love. Jesus reminds us that there will be difficulty in our lives, but we are to take heart. We are Christians, and we have every reason to live with hope.

When we look at the cross we see the one who modelled obedience to the Father in all things. We see the ultimate sacrifice. We see love. As we celebrate Father's Day this Sunday, we can reflect on another kind of love and sacrifice in our lives—that which our fathers and the father figures in our lives have made and continue to make for us. Fatherhood provides a man with endless opportunities to make sacrifices for a child; to model love, to share love, and to be love. And for this, today we thank you. **Vanessa Carnevale.**
