A reflection...

I enjoy watching police procedural shows on TV, especially British ones such as *Midsomer Murders, Vera*, and *Shetland*. When the police arrive at the scene of a crime the first question that they often ask is "Who is in charge here?" In today's Gospel the Pharisees set a trap for Jesus, effectively asking the same question, "Who is in charge, is it God or is it Caesar?" We could perhaps ask the same question of ourselves. Who is in charge, is it the Prime Minister, or the Premier of Victoria, or perhaps King Charles? As Christians, we recognise that ultimately God is in charge. God has created the whole universe including us, and as the Book of Genesis tells us, God has tasked us with being the stewards of God's creation. We need rulers and governments to create peace, order, and security so that we may flourish and so that the common good of all may be assured. Their authority, however, comes in the first instance from God, even though we have a role to play in deciding who will be in charge. We have a responsibility to be both good Christians and good citizens.
