

New chapter for Caloundra Library

Over the past year, Council has completed detailed feasibility and preliminary design to re-purpose the existing Caloundra Administration Building at Omrah Avenue into a new District Library.

The three-level building will also include a Customer Service Centre, community meeting space and Council administration offices.

The new contemporary District Library will replace the existing Library in Felicity Park.


The major refurbishment is part of:

- The broader Caloundra Centre Activation Project which aligns with the visions of the Caloundra Centre Master Plan, endorsed by Council in 2017. You can find updates on this major project on Council's website.

Timeline

The detailed design for the new District Library and community meeting space is set to get underway in July 2021.

It is anticipated the refurbishments will begin mid next year (2022) and that the new Caloundra District Library will open its doors to the community early in 2024.

The current Library

The existing Caloundra Library is the busiest library in the Sunshine Coast Library Network, and one of the oldest.

Every year more than 300,000 people visit the Caloundra Library, borrowing almost 450,000 items from the collection.

With a floor space of 1120sqm, the existing Library opened 25 years ago and was designed to cater for a much smaller population. The Library is now bursting at the seams.



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The new Library

The new Caloundra District Library, Customer Service Centre and community meeting space will be developed over three levels of the existing Caloundra Council Administration Building. The Library will provide a typically Queensland indoor/outdoor experience with spaces for all ages and users.

This will be the first new library for the Sunshine Coast Local Government area in more than 20 years. It will replace the existing Caloundra Library which opened its doors to the public in 1986.
