What is a district-level recreational park?

Recreation parks are primarily used by the community for informal recreation, social, cultural and leisure activities and which may provide for other complimentary values associated with site (e.g. landscape amenity or conservation). They are generally acquired and developed to service a range of catchments: Parks that service the Sunshine Coast generally, and those that service Districts and Local areas. The new park at Buderim has been acquired to function as a district level park.

A District park provides greater range of passive recreational opportunities than can normally be accommodated in local parks including more diverse play spaces, picnic and social spaces, kick-about areas, opportunities for art and artistic expression. They may also provide access to natural bushland areas or link to recreation trail and pathway networks. Obviously, the unique and defining features of each site need to be considered when designing and creating these places.
