# things to look forward to in 2017

## The Sunshine Coast Solar Farm comes online

When the 15 megawatt (MV) solar farm at Valdora is complete by mid next year, Sunshine Coast Council will become Australia's first local government to offset 100% of its electricity consumption with energy from a renewable source. The solar farm will be the largest in Queensland and will deliver \$22 million in savings, after costs, for our ratepayers over the next 30 years.

#### The first season of the Sunshine Coast Lightning

Excitement is building as the first Sunshine Coast team to compete in a national professional sporting competition prepares to play its inaugural season in the Suncorp Super Netball League. Televised nationwide on Channel Nine, the competition starts on February 18 with the Lightning against the Queensland Firebirds in Brisbane. The first home game will be at the upgraded USC Sports Stadium on February 26.

#### Celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the Naming of the Sunshine Coast

We are getting set to celebrate half a century of people, places and events in the region since the Sunshine Coast officially received its name. The 50th Anniversary of the Naming of the Sunshine Coast will be commemorated on August 1 and we're planning celebrations throughout 2017 to mark this special occasion. Keep an eye out for the calendar of events which will be released early in the New Year.

#### Our new city centre emerges

Get ready as our new Maroochydore
City Centre – Australia's only greenfield
CBD within an existing urban area –
takes shape. Construction will start
on great new city streets, parks and a
stunning new central waterway in 2017.
The project will deliver more than 30,000
jobs by 2040, contribute \$4.4 billion to
the Sunshine Coast economy and is
attracting world-wide interest.

#### Opening the Mt Ninderry trail

Great news for everyone who loves to get outdoors and enjoy our beautiful environment. The second stage of the Mt Ninderry trail upgrade will open in 2017 with three viewing areas set to provide views out to the Blackall Range, north to Lake Weyba and across Mt Coolum to Mooloolaba. New directional signage will also be installed to help walkers enjoy the area.

#### Bulcock St lights up

A modern, dynamic canopy lighting feature will be installed in Bulcock Street following this year's streetscape upgrade. The bespoke LED lighting feature will weave across the street and use innovative region-first technology to light up the area at night and provide shade during the day.

#### Discover Mary Cairncross Scenic Reserve

One of the Coast's most popular destinations is about to become even better. Visitors to the Mary Cairncross Scenic Reserve will enjoy an educational experience at the new Discovery Centre, with an elevated viewing platform and boardwalk and meeting theatrette when it opens next year.

#### Construction starts on the Sunshine Coast Airport expansion project

Scheduled for completion in 2020, the airport expansion will link our region directly to new destinations in Australia, Asia and the Western Pacific. It will enable more choice, more flights and will directly connect with key tourism, investment and export markets. It will generate 2230 jobs and contribute \$4.1 billion to our local economy through to 2040.

## Sunshine Coast University Hospital opens

The State Government's new \$1.8 billion public hospital will open in April 2017 and will continue to be a major contributor to our region's economy. When it is fully commissioned more than 10,000 patients each year will no longer have to travel to Brisbane for complex treatment.

#### A winter cycling escape

Thousands of riders and their friends and family will converge on our region for the ultimate winter cycling escape, Velothon Sunshine Coast, from July 13-16. Based at Mooloolaba, the race for elite and age-group compertitors will be part of the Velothon Series, which includes events in Germany, Canada, Sweden and Wales, and is expected to inject about \$3.5 million into our local economy.
