New Footpath – Coochin Street, Dicky Beach

Project summary

Sunshine Coast Council will be constructing a new footpath along the North side of Coochin Street, Dicky Beach.

The new path will connect the existing footpath on Cooroy Street with the coastal pathway at Dicky Beach Surf Club.

Please refer to the location of works in figure 1 overleaf.

The design has been carefully reviewed to minimise vegetation clearing wherever possible, however approximately six trees will be removed to facilitate the new pathway.

To offset the removal, new trees/landscaping will be planted along the new pathway following the completion of the works.

Start date

Works are expected to start Monday 6 November 2023 and be finished within two weeks, weather and site conditions permitting.

Property access and parking

Property access should not be affected during the works. However, if the contractor requires access, property owners will be notified in advance.

On-street parking along Coochin Street may be limited at times for the safety of pedestrians, road users and contractors.
