
Throughout most of history, India was perceived as a land-based and land-oriented country, its eyes set firmly inwards, with the sea just there – perhaps to be drawn on maps for school atlases and, for some, to be discussed as part of the Indian defence services. In *Empires of the Sea*, Radhika Seshan sets to rights this wrongful perception by looking at India's maritime past and its place in the Indian Ocean world.

The book covers trade routes, networks and empires built across the seas that connect India to the rest of the world – from the Sangam era up to the long colonial period. Combining academic rigour, scholarship, a storyteller's flair and a selection of maps and photographs, here is a story of the connections, continuities and changes that occurred in India through maritime explorations and relationships over a period of 2,000 years.




From overcoming stupendous trials to inscribing her name in the annals of women's liberation, Rukhmabai's journey is marked by a quiet, unyielding strength. Denied formal education and wedded off at eleven years of age to a nineteen-year-old wastrel named Dadaji Bhikaji, Rukhmabai refused to live with him and was dragged into a vexatious legal suit for the 'restitution of conjugal rights'. The suit set off a huge social and political debate of far-reaching importance, establishing her as a salient figure of global feminism and, along with the backing of notable reformers.

This soon paved the way for her move to the United Kingdom to study medicine. She returned to India a celebrity but chose an unglamorous life of service through medical practice. She spent the next many years, until her retirement in 1929, leading hospitals in Surat and Rajkot through two pandemics, performing daring surgeries, awakening women across classes and inspiring them to openly seek medical treatment.

An outcome of research spanning decades, Sudhir Chandra's intelligent, empathetic biography shines brilliant new light on this extraordinary but little-known life of a rebel-doctor who dared to challenge the norms of her time and left behind a formidable legacy. The radical view she proposed of woman's freedom is yet to be fully realized.



Sudhir Chandra has dedicated his career to studying the evolution of modern Indian social consciousness in response to colonial influence. In addition to his teaching positions at Melbourne University, Aligarh Muslim University and Jamia Millia Islamia, Chandra has held visiting professorships and fellowships at prestigious institutions such as the Indian Institute of Advanced Study, Nehru Memorial Museum & Library, Cornell University and Tokyo University of Foreign Studies.

Together, they traverse love, loss and survival as their community teeters on the edge of rupture, with the tempest exposing truths that have long simmered just beneath the surface.

Set against the intractable Arabian Sea, *Glass Bottom* offers a profound and lyrical meditation on the ordinary and strange places we occupy, and the ties binding us to our planet and to each other, while simultaneously heralding the arrival of a distinctive literary talent.




In the autumn of 2011, the postman-turned-journalist Daniel Bosley embarked on an unexpected adventure, which started as an internship in London's Maldives High Commission – the diplomatic mission of the Indian Ocean tourism hotspot. Little did he know that he would soon set off on an odyssey through an imperilled island nation undergoing one of the most tumultuous periods in its history.

Over the next seven years, Bosley worked as a journalist in the Maldives, reporting on its volatile political landscape and shattering the picture-perfect view of this supposed paradise. He reveals a shaded past of sultans, imperialists and Western explorers followed by a modern-day dictatorship which was finally overturned by a democracy immediately plunged into turmoil. While dissenters and intrepid reporters were abducted, imprisoned, and even killed, the climate crisis and Islamist zealots posed even greater threats to the country's vulnerable environment and ancient culture.

Richly observed and infused with empathy and humour, *Descent into Paradise* thoroughly alters our understanding of the Maldives, a place where magical waters and surreal skies hide unthinkable dangers even as the struggle for justice risks submersion.



Daniel Bosley is a British journalist whose unlikely career path saw him go from being a postman in Cheshire to reporting on political crises in the Republic of Maldives in a matter of months. He was the editor of local newspaper *Minivan News*. His work has also appeared in international publications, including the *Economist*, *Reuters* and *Himal Southasian*. He later co-founded the history and culture website Two Thousand Isles with his wife, photographer Aishath Naj.






In the Sati series, Koral Dasgupta explores the lives of the Pancha Kanyas from the Hindu epics and reinvents them with a feminist consciousness.
