### What is RPL?

"RPL" stands for Recognition of Prior Learning. It's a method used in education and training to assess and recognise the skills, knowledge, and experience a person has gained that may not have been formally assessed.

#### Here's how it works:

The individual provides evidence of their prior learning, such as the example of work completed during their work or their knowledge and understanding of how they performed the work activity.

Trained assessors review the evidence provided by the individual. They compare it against a particular course or qualification's learning outcomes or competency standards.

If the individual's prior learning is equivalent to the learning outcomes or competencies required for a specific course or qualification, they may receive recognition. This recognition could take the form of credits, exemptions, or even the awarding of a full qualification, depending on the assessment outcome.

RPL is a valuable assessment method because it acknowledges the diverse ways in which individuals acquire knowledge and skills, and it helps to make education and training more accessible and flexible.

## **Next steps**

If you are continuing your Learning Journey but have decided to undertake your qualification with another Awarding Organisation, there are no agreed arrangements to transfer registrations between Awarding Organisations, and you may be required to pay a registration fee for a different organisation.
