African American, African, and Black Diaspora Studies 604 titles

This collection includes important, interdisciplinary books about the Black experience around the world.

- Brings together three distinct yet interconnected fields to study Blackness from a global perspective.
- Reflects Duke Press's longstanding leadership in African American studies.
- Our African studies titles offer an interdisciplinary take on traditional area studies.
- Our Black diaspora studies titles include notable authors such as C. L. R. James, Sylvia Wynter, and Achille Mbembe.
- Includes poetry, creative criticism, and other methods to push the boundaries of scholarly writing.



Anthropology 782 titles

This collection includes major ethnographies by important authors in the cultural anthropology field.

- Reflects Duke Press's role as one of the most prominent publishers in cultural anthropology since the 1990s.
- Among the first to connect anthropology and cultural studies.
- Contains a mix of traditional ethnographies, broader cultural and theoretical analyses, and experiments in writing anthropology.
- Touches every corner of the globe, including places that have historically not been sites of ethnography, such as urban centers in Western countries, Wall Street, and television studios.
- Covers diverse subject areas, including medical anthropology,
 Native and Indigenous studies, ethnomusicology, media studies,
 and the anthropology of science.

Art and Art History 296 titles

This collection includes titles in art theory and criticism, performance art, architecture, visual culture, photography, and museum studies.

- Includes titles by noted artists such as Lorraine O'Grady, Maya Stovall, Wadsworth A. Jarrell, Suzanne Lacy, and Mira Schor.
- Includes topics such as Andy Warhol, art in the Brazilian dictatorship, North American Indigenous art, the history of photography, performance art, African technological art, comics in Japan and Latin America, and Middle Eastern queer art.



Asian Studies 478 titles

This collection offers cutting-edge, multidisciplinary scholarship on contemporary and historical topics in Asian studies.

- Covers a large geographical area including China, Japan, India, Southeast Asia, and Korea.
- Includes titles that have won numerous awards from the Association for Asian Studies.
- Recent titles cover the politics of monumental icons in contemporary India, the ongoing influence of the US military on the beauty industry in Vietnam, the lifestyle of residents of a poor neighborhood in Beijing, and the life of Filipina vaudeville and film actress Isabel Rosario Cooper.



Gender Studies 851 titles

This collection includes groundbreaking titles in gender studies, gay and lesbian studies, transgender studies, transnational women's studies, and queer and feminist theory.

- Provides foundational scholarship for any gender studies program.
- Among the first to connect gender studies (i.e. feminist theory) and sexuality studies (i.e. queer theory).
- Includes research at the forefront of transgender studies.
- Includes highly intersectional and transnational research that explores what gender and sexuality studies mean beyond the English-speaking world.
- Strong in African American studies, anthropology, film and media studies, Latinx studies, music, and science studies.





This collection includes important work by key authors in Latin American studies.


- Provides foundational scholarship for any Latin American studies program. Includes all titles in our popular and influential Latin American Readers series.
- Covers a broad range of history and culture from pre-Columbian times to the present.
- Features prominent authors including Marisol de la Cadena, Arturo Escobar, Gilbert M. Joseph, Walter Mignolo, Margaret Randall, and Boaventura de Sousa Santos.



Music and Sound Studies 213 titles

This collection covers the traditional study of music and ethnomusicology, as well as the broader social, cultural, and technological dimensions of sound.

- Includes memoirs and biographies from Thomas Mapfumo, Tony Allen, William Parker, Randy Weston, Arthur Russell, and Paul Robeson.
- Features writings by critics Robert Christgau, Greg Tate, Chuck Eddy, and John Corbett.
- Draws on broad subject areas including anthropology, cultural studies, gender studies, African American studies, history, science and technology studies, Latin American studies, and sociology.



Religious Studies 174 titles

This collection includes titles that examine religions around the world, conflicts within and among religions, and the cultural, social, and political dynamics of religion.

- Features notable authors including Judith Casselberry, Stanley Hauerwas, Amy Laura Hall, Robert N. Bellah, and Donovan O. Schaefer.
- Recent titles cover internal community dynamics among
 Black evangelicals, the revival of Charismatic Catholicism in
 Brazil, the emergence of Hindutva in India, the intersections
 of modern politics and religious formations in communities
 around the world, and the resurgence of religion and ritual
 in Wenzhou, China.

Environmental Humanities 129 titles

This collection includes titles that intermingle key areas of environmental study with a wide variety of disciplines.

- Challenges traditional boundaries of environmental studies to reflect a growing overlap of fields across humanities disciplines.
- Incorporates classic areas of environmental studies, such as anthropology and geography, with environmental humanities (e.g. literary studies and Indigenous studies) and fields growing in popularity (e.g. multispecies interactions and oceanic studies).



LGBTQIA+ Studies 277 titles

This collection, which exists under the larger umbrella of the Gender Studies collection, includes titles that focus on growing and expanding the areas of study with which queer theory intersects.

- Exemplifies Duke Press's long-standing relationship with queer theory.
- Includes titles that are international and intersectional.
- Brings subjects such as Black studies, disability studies, fiction, and politics into conversation with queer identity to move beyond traditional academic boundaries and enrich the intellectual engagement of a broader audience.



Transgender Studies 26 titles

This collection, which exists under the larger umbrellas of the Gender Studies and LGBTQIA+ Studies collections, offers distinctly bold, theoretically informed, and broadly interdisciplinary scholarship of transness in the modern world.

- Reflects Duke Press's role as one of the first presses to publish titles in this area, expanding on early transgender studies that emerged primarily from sociological and historical perspectives.
- Represents a relatively new yet vibrant area within gender, sexuality, and women's studies focusing specifically on trans experiences and perspectives on various spheres of life.
